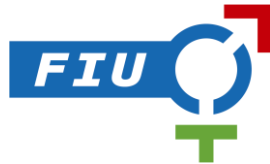

Background info for the trainer/teacher of the online course:

Sexual harassment and co-worker responsibility

The aim of the course

In this course the focus is on how co-workers can participate in preventing and dealing with sexual harassment. The participants will gain insight into why it is important to think about sexual harassment as an issue that involves every single person in the workplace. Furthermore, the participants will learn about how to intervene as bystanders to sexual harassment. The aim of the course is to make the participants able to bring this knowledge and these tools into their own workplace, and to start actively creating a work environment in which there is a sense of shared responsibility for preventing and dealing with sexual harassment.

About the PowerPoint:

The entire course is contained in the PowerPoint which consists of 11 slides.

Everything that is thought relevant for the teacher to say about each slide is written out in the note below each slide. The text in the notes that are in a squared parenthesis [] is meant as a note to the teacher.

Exercise:

This course includes one exercise which is described on slide 8.

The exercise is meant for the participants to start exploring and practicing how to become an active bystander and thereby participating in the prevention and handling of sexual harassment. The exercise is also meant to foster reflection and conversation about the possibilities and challenges of taking on the role as an active bystander to sexual harassment.
